## Remember:

• Memory Errors: Unidentifiable in Context

1)

Is this a Memory error?

- You ask the student to write a capital P. It looks like this.
- This is a Memory error. It is unidentifiable in context.

2)



Is this letter a Memory error?

- You ask the student to make a lowercase u. It looks like this.
- This is NOT a Memory error. In context, this letter can be recognized as a u. It looks like a D'Nealian u. Therefore, it is identifiable in context.

3)



Is this a capital Memory error?

- You ask the student to write a capital letter Q but they write a lowercase letter q.
- This is a capital Memory error.

4)



Is this a lowercase Memory error?

- You ask the student to write a lowercase y. It looks like the Y
  that is shown on the left.
- This is a lowercase Memory error.

5)



Is this letter a Memory error?

- You ask the student to write a lowercase d and they write a lowercase b.
- This is NOT a Memory error. It is an Orientation error.
